Reflections from Fr. Daryl

As you drove by the west parking lot this last week or as you arrived for mass this weekend, you may have noticed some new signs by the entrances. By the East entrance there is now an Entrance Only sign and on the West entrance there is now an Exit Only sign. And you may be wondering why these have been added.

As we have watched the parking lot on school days, we have noticed that there is an increased risk of a student being hit while both arriving at school and leaving at the end of the day. To greatly reduce this risk, I along with Tad Hatfield and Chief Mark Cook, have put together a plan for pick up and drop off for the safety of our students.

The first part of the plan is for the school faculty and staff to begin parking on the north end of the parking lot. This opens up the main part of the parking lot during the pickup and drop off periods, creating greater visibility in the parking lot. The area toward the south end will be open for parishioners to park for daily mass and for parents who need to go into the school to park and walk their children into school. It will also allow for volunteers to park during the school day.

The second part of the new plan is the entrance and exit only signs. All parents dropping off their students will enter through the East entrance and proceed to the north, turning toward the school and then driving along the curb of the school to drop off their students, curb side only. This will ensure the safety of the children as well as improve the flow of traffic through the parking lot. To make this possible, you will see No Parking On School Days on the school building along the curb. I would ask that parishioners attending daily Mass to help keep these spots open for pick up and drop off.

The final part of this new plan has been opening driving lanes on the north end of the parking lot. We have eliminated parking spots on the west end of row of parking to allow for traffic to flow along the guard rails. This will also allow for emergency vehicles to gain better access to the school building in emergencies.

I believe the new entrance and exit signs will also benefit our parish and create much better and safer traffic flow in our parking lot for the weekend masses and other parish functions. I would ask that you help us improve the safety of all by following these new procedures.
