

Reflections from Fr. Daryl

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of our Lord. In this celebration, we are filled with gratitude for the precious gift our Lord has given to us. Our Lord promised to remain with us until his return in glory and through the Eucharist, we see him present with us. He has taught us clearly that unless you eat of my flesh and drink of my blood, you will not have life within you. Our hearts are filled with joy in knowing we have the new life found in Christ with us each time we receive the Eucharist. Through this most precious gift, we are nourished and sustained in God's everlasting love.

The Church refers to the Eucharist as the source and summit of our lives. It is the source of our lives as is the very life of God that that we receive in communion. With the life of our Lord within us, we are filled with the necessary grace to live as his faithful disciples. After being sent out two by two, the disciples return to the Lord filled with joy as they were able to cast out demons and teach in the name of Jesus. When we have carried out the Lord's will in our lives, we too can return to the Eucharist, rejoicing as we come back to the summit of our lives.

On Friday June 8th we celebrate the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Jesus stated, there is no greater love than this, than to lay down one's life for one's friend. His death on the cross fills us with the fullness of his love and mercy. In the opening prayer for this day we pray "Grant, we pray, almighty God, that we, who glory in the Heart of your beloved Son and recall the wonders of his love for us, may be made worthy to receive an overflowing measure of grace from that fount of heavenly gifts." Our Lord Jesus is waiting for us to come to him and seek his grace and love. Ready to provide for us the comfort and grace we need to live as his children. Our Blessed Mother will open our hearts to hear the voice of her son.
