Reflections from Fr. Daryl

Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and reviling must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ. (Eph 4:30)

In much of the writings of St. Paul, he speaks to the people about the workings of the Holy Spirit in the individual lives of the disciples as well as the Church. St. Paul fully understood and believed the promise of Jesus that he would send his advocate, the Holy Spirit into the hearts of the faithful. In this brief passage, we find a strong reminder of how our attitude and our response to the things around us can impact our peace and happiness.

St. Paul begins with the words, "Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God." We have been sealed with the Holy Spirit through the sacrament of Confirmation, a gift that we carry with us throughout our lives here on earth. Notice what St. Paul tells us grieves the Holy Spirit; bitterness, fury, anger and shouting. When we recognize the peace the Holy Spirit gives to us, we will seek to remove these things from our hearts and lives. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we will begin to recognize that anger and bitterness do not come from others, but always flows from within our hearts. We will recognize that anger is our response to something that takes place outside of us. We are always in full control of how we respond to the life events that we encounter throughout our day.

Yes, people will do things that upset and hurt us. This is a part of life. But, we control our response. We can respond in bitterness or anger or we can respond with the work of the Holy Spirit with the very things St. Paul teaches us. The Holy Spirit fills the hearts of the faithful with kindness, compassion and forgiveness. Each of these leads one to quickly let go of the anger and bitterness, which brings the peace of Christ into ones heart. When we fully allow the Holy Spirit to work in our lives, we will experience a deeper desire for kindness, compassion and forgiveness. Let us daily call upon the Holy Spirit to enlighten and strengthen us.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, Through Christ Our Lord.

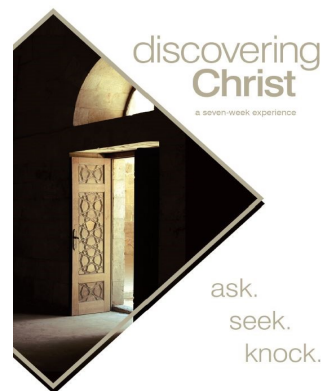
