

Reflections from Fr. Daryl

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. (James 2:14-16)

As Jesus proclaimed the Kingdom of God, we find him doing so both in word and in deed. He clearly teaches the people about the commandments of God through his preaching. All that Jesus taught was confirmed through the miracles he performed. Setting the example for us to not only hear and receive his word, but to then put his word into action in our lives. Before he returns to the Father, he gives the command to go and teach all nations. This command is to be fulfilled through our word and our deeds.

In our definition of Stewardship, we are reminded that we are called to "to share our gifts in love of God and neighbor." The forth pillar of Stewardship is Service. LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. Catholics who are ages 18 to 59 are obliged to fast, that is, take only one full meal and two lesser meals, with nothing to eat in between meals. Drinking fluids would not be contrary to the practice of fasting. Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstaining from meat. All Catholics who are 14 years of age and older are obliged to abstain from eating meat.
