## Reflections from Fr. Daryl

Through His ministry, Jesus cured many various illnesses. Through his healing power, those who came to him or were brought to him received the physical healing they desired. Bringing this healing to the sick continues through the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick.

While at times referred to as last rites, one does not need to be near death to receive the Sacrament. In the letter of St. James we read, "Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priest pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayers of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise them up and if they have committed any sins, their sins will be forgiven them." (James 5:14-15) Through these words, we find the two healings that can occur through this sacrament. The first is the healing of the soul. The person is freed from sin and shares in the mercy and love of Christ. The second is the healing of the illness. This healing from our Lord is granted to the person so that through the healing, the person may grow in their love of Christ.

If you know you will be going in for a major surgery for example, please contact me so I may fulfill these words of St. James through the Sacrament and bring the healing of our Lord as well as His grace and comfort.

The Anointing of the Sick is our opportunity to bring the love and peace of Christ to the sick and the dying. It is especially important to offer the sacrament when one is nearing death. As with all Sacraments, it is for the living. While not always possible in times of an emergency, it is good to contact a priest to ensure that your loved one receives the sacrament.

There are times, when I do not find out a parishioner is in the hospital until after they have returned home. I would ask that when you or a loved one is in the hospital, please contact me or the office so that I may have the opportunity to visit them and provide them with the anointing of the sick.

Father Daryl will be out of town as he leads two stewardship conferences, from Friday, March 24 through Friday, March 31. In case of emergency, please contact Father Brian at 796.1604. There will be daily Mass, **except** for Friday, March 31.
