## Reflections from Fr. Daryl

One day a small boy was trying to lift a heavy stone, but couldn't budge it. His father, passing by, stopped to watch his son's efforts. Finally he said to his son: "Are you using all of your strength?" Exasperated, the boy cried, "Yes, I am." "No you're not," said the father calmly. "You haven't asked me to help you."

In our lives as disciples of our Lord, we are most often like the small boy in the story. Our heavenly Father is watching us try to live as faithful disciples and most often we are trying to achieve our goals relying on our own strength. We seem to believe that we must accomplish all things on our own. Our heavenly Father is looking over us asking us are we using all of our strength.

Today we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. We find the disciples locked in the upper room after Jesus has returned to the Father. They are filled with fear and trepidation wondering what they must now do. Jesus has left them the command to make disciples of all nations. Yet they fear that if they go out and proclaim the good news of Gospel, they too will be put to death as Jesus was. As they are filled with the Holy Spirit, their hearts are filled with joy and they immediately go out and begin to proclaim the Gospel.

Jesus gave us the promise that he would send the Holy Spirit to be our advocate throughout our lives as disciples. The Holy Spirit fills us with the gifts necessary to fulfill the will of Christ in our lives. Yet, how often do we actually call upon the Holy Spirit to assist us in our times of need? Do we even know the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit so we might seek those gifts in the different situations in our lives.

In the prayer over those to be confirmed in the Sacrament of Confirmation we receive the following gifts from the Holy Spirit: **the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and courage, the spirit of knowledge and reverence. Fill them with the spirit of wonder and awe in your presence.** These gifts are given to us to give us the strength to faithfully live our lives as disciples.

Whether we are in a conversation that calls us to defend the faith or in a moment of temptation, these gifts are with us to lead us to faithfulness to our Lord. As we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, let us call upon the Holy Spirit.

## STEWARDSHIP

The Jewish feast of Pentecost is an ancient one that is associated with the harvesting of grains. It began at Passover and concluded seven weeks later, on Pentecost. On this day, the people would bring "the first fruits" of their labors as an offering in gratitude to God. In the Christian tradition, Pentecost marks the day Christians received a tremendous gift from God – the gift of the Holy Spirit. Today's readings remind us of what this gift means for us. In his letter to the Corinthians, Paul tells us, "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." In the Gospel of John, Jesus says, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." It is clear that we have been given much, and we are expected to return the first fruits of our labor to God. It is no coincidence that the Apostles received the gift of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. They were being sent forth, just as we are also being sent forth on a very special kind of harvest. The Spirit that gave the Apostles courage and wisdom for this task does the same for you and I as we go in peace, glorifying the Lord by our lives!
