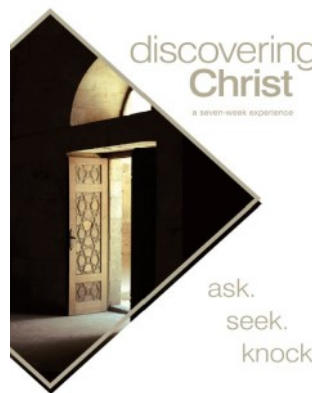

The gospel reminds us that, "Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known." It sounds like Jesus is telling us not to behave in a manner that we would not want revealed. Instead, behave in a way that would certainly find us guilty of being a Christian! We should proclaim our faith in Jesus, share His teachings with those we encounter, and not be afraid to stand up for our belief. We can find consolation in the words of the prophet, Jeremiah: "But the LORD is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph." Do not be afraid to dedicate your life to the glorification of the Lord!
