Reflections from Fr. Daryl

At the mountain of God, Horeb,
Elijah came to a cave where he took shelter.
Then the LORD said to him,
"Go outside and stand on the mountain before the
LORD;
the LORD will be passing by."
A strong and heavy wind was rending the moun-
tains
and crushing rocks before the LORD—
but the LORD was not in the wind.
After the wind there was an earthquake—
but the LORD was not in the earthquake.
After the earthquake there was fire—
but the LORD was not in the fire.
After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound.
When he heard this,
Elijah hid his face in his cloak
and went and stood at the entrance of the cave.
(1 Kings 19:9A, 11-13)

Elijah was one of the great prophets of the Old Testament. In the passage above, we find him at the mountain of God. God intends to pass by Elijah as he stands outside the cave. After the great events of wind, and earthquake and fire, there comes a tiny whispering sound. Elijah immediately recognizes that this is God passing by and hides his face.

When we seek God in our lives, too often we are looking for him in the spectacular. We will go to great distances to visit churches and religious sights to feel his presence. This passage reminds us that while God will show himself to us in many of these things, we find him most often when we silence our heart and mind and listen for the whispering sound of his voice. We can do this anywhere, in our homes, in front of the Blessed Sacrament or sitting on the back porch. God is always waiting to speak to us in our hearts, but we must take the first step of quieting our minds.

THE TWELVE STEPS: A SPIRITUAL JOURNEY

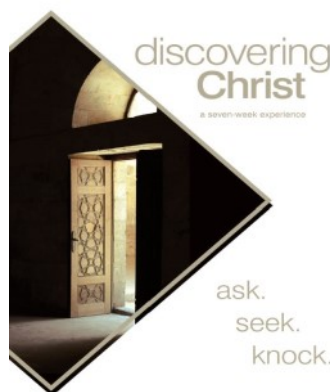
